

#### **FAQ and Campground Policy**

#### • I would like to cancel my reservation, what is the cancellation policy:

A full refund will be given if you have canceled 48 hours or more in advance of check in time. No refunds can be given for cancellations less than 48 hours of check in time.

#### • How to cancel my reservation:

Please contact deyo@weippe.com to cancel your reservation. If you are due a refund your refund will be returned to the card used to place the reservation 3-4 days after cancellation.

# • I would like to stay longer than two weeks, can I?:

Please contact the Deyo campground at deyo@weippe.com or call 208-435-4406 before planning a stay longer than 2 weeks. At this time only specific camp sites can be reserved for extended stays over 2 weeks.

# • I don't need hookups (or they're full), can I camp outside designated camp sites:

No! Camping is allowed only in designated areas.

### • What is your policy regarding Dogs?:

Dogs are required to be on a leash at all times, while walking with the dog and inside the camp site area. Out of courtesy for others, you are required to pick up after your dog in the camp site and anywhere on the Deyo Campgrounds and Reservoir trails.

# • Can I use my boat on the Reservoir?:

Yes! Non motorized and motorized boats are allowed on the reservoir. There is a mandatory "no wake" rule.

## • What is the Idaho fishing limits for Deyo Reservoir?:

Current rules are – Daily bag limit of 6 Trout per person and a limit of 2 Bass over 16 inches. Sunfish/Blue gills have no limit. You may look at all current Idaho fishing rules at

#### What is the policy regarding burning garbage in the fire pit :

Burning garbage in the fire pit or leaving garbage in the fire pit is prohibited and may incur a permanent ban from the Deyo Campground. Garbage containers are available in the East and West Campgrounds.

### • What is your policy on hunting, discharging of a firearm or fireworks:

Hunting is allowed in the designated hunting zone only! Discharging of a firearm on Deyo Reservoir and Campground property is prohibited. Fireworks are prohibited. You will be asked to leave and will be banned from the Deyo Campground if you fail to follow this policy.

#### • Is there a speed limit in the Deyo Campground and Reservoir?:

There is a 5 mile per hour speed limit in the campgrounds and in the public and boat parking area.

#### • Can I ride my motorized vehicle in the campground:

All motorized vehicles; motorcycles, atv, utv must be kept on designated graveled roads. Driving on the grass/dirt of camping sites or anywhere off the gravel on the Deyo Reservoir and Campground is prohibited.

#### • Is there water available for the East campsites:

There are 2 water spikets with potable water available.

#### • I am staying in the East campsite, can I run a hose to the spiket and fill up my water tanks:

No. If you need to fill up a water tank on your trailer, there is a public filling site in the nearby small town of Weippe that is available.

# • Does Deyo Reservoir and Campground have a sewer dump:

Deyo Campground does not have a dumping station on site. If you need to empty your sewer, there is a dumping station in the nearby small town of Weippe. Running your sewer hose into the vault toilets, emptying into Deyo reservoir, or onto Deyo property, is not permitted. You will be permanently banned.

#### • Do you have trash containers available:

Each campground contains a trash container for use by paid campers.

#### • I have a motorized vehicle, where should I park them:

All motorized vehicles; motorcycles, utv, boats, extra vehicles etc.; must be parked in designated parking areas, such as the Deyo Reservoir parking area.

#### What are the quiet hours for Deyo Campground:

Quiet hours are from 10pm to 7am

#### • How many camper/trailers/ tents in each paid site:

1 Camper/Trailer and 1 tent (for children) per site.

#### • Check in/Check out Time:

11:00am is check out and 1:00pm is check in. Late checkouts incur additional fees unless prior arrangements have been made with the camp host.
